This interactive wellness workshop focuses on exploring dance as a method for promoting health at all ages. A Short History of the Earth Thursday, October 12, 19, 26 @ 2:00 pm

Session One: The geologic timescale - relative & radiometric dating. Origin of Earth, plate tectonics.

Session Three: Mesozoic Era and

Dale Gnidovec, who is Curator of Ohio State's Orton Geological Museum where he takes care of over 54,000 rocks, minerals, and fossils, and the exhibit hall.

He also identifies rocks, minerals, fossils, and bones. He speaks to nearly 5,000 people a year including elementary through high

school classes, Scouts, and other youth groups, at parks, libraries, nature centers, retirement communities, clubs, and teaches an Earth History course at Ohio State. He also writes a geology column that appears periodically in The Columbus Dispatch.



A total eclipse of the Sun is one of nature's wonders, an eerily majestic show that you won't want to miss. In this talk, we'll discuss what to expect during April's eclipse and how best to view it; about the beautiful outer layers of the Sun that are only visible during total eclipses; why solar eclipses can only occur during a new Moon, while lunar eclipses require a full Moon; why we don't have eclipses at every new and full Moon; and more!

Robert is Professor and Chair of the Department of Physics and Astronomy at Ohio Wesleyan University. He earned a B.S. in Astronomy at Case Western Reserve University and a Ph.D. in Physics at the University of Chicago. Before coming to Ohio Wesleyan in 1999, Harmon taught at Washington College and Randolph Macon College and was a visiting researcher at the Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics. At Ohio Wesleyan he enjoys teaching physics and astronomy courses for students majoring within his department, as well as those majoring in other fields, and is a recipient of OWU's Sherwood Dodge Shankland Award for the

Teachers. His research program focuses on stellar magnetic fields and their manifestation in the form of dark "starspots" in their surface layers.
